Lesson Focus

If we really want to know and experience God, we must be balanced. God gave us the Spirit within, as well as the Bible without to lead us and guide us into the experience and riches of Him.

The entire Bible originates from God; every word and every sentence, every iota and every title, are God-inspired.

Key Verses

2 Tim. 3:16 All Scripture is God-breathed and profitable for teaching, for conviction, for correction, for instruction in righteousness.

2 Pet. 1:20-21

20 Knowing this first, that no prophecy of Scripture is of one's own interpretation **21** for no prophecy was ever borne by the will of man, but men spoke from God while being borne by the Holy Spirit.

Lesson 2: The Functions of the Bible

Lesson Focus

The Bible as a book is not limited to having a single function, rather it has multiple functions. Through the Bible we can know God, receive God, be nourished and supplied by God, and become a man of God.

Key Verses

John 5:39 You search the Scriptures, because you think that in them you have eternal life; and it is these that testify concerning Me.

2 Tim. 3:15-17

15 And that from a babe you have known the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise unto salvation through the faith which is in Christ Jesus. **16** All Scripture is God-breathed and profitable for teaching, for conviction, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, **17** That the man of God may be complete, fully equipped for every good work.

Lesson 3: The Writing of the Bible

Lesson Focus

God used over forty men over a period of about 1600 years to write the Bible. Only the present 66 books are recognized as the Word of God.

The subject of the Bible is contained in only four sentences: God planned and created, Satan rebelled and damaged, man fell and was lost, and Christ redeemed and built.

The central thought of the Bible is Christ and the church. The Bible not only reveals Christ Himself; it also reveals the bride and the Body of Christ, which is the church.

Key Verses

Eph. 3:9-11

9 And to enlighten all *that they may see* what the economy of the mystery is, which throughout the ages has been hidden in God, who created all things, **10** In order that now to the rulers and the authorities in the heavenlies the multifarious wisdom of God might be made known through the church, **11** According to the eternal purpose which He made in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Eph. 5:32 This mystery is great, but I speak with regard to Christ and the church.

How does it make you feel knowing the Bible confirmed science long before science realized it was "wrong."?

Lesson 5: The Proof of the Bible Being the Word of God (2)

Lesson Focus

In this lesson, as a continuation of Lesson 4, we see more objective proofs that the Bible is the Word of God.

The proof provided in these two lessons increases our faith in and appreciation for the Bible. The Lord and His lovers suffered much to preserve the Bible for thousands of years so that we, the lovers of the Lord, may have this great gift. We need to treasure the Bible and study it as the most precious thing we have.

Key Verses

1 Pet. 1:24-25a

24 All flesh is like grass, and all its glory like the flower of grass. The grass has withered, and the flower has fallen off, **25** But the word of the Lord abides forever.

Lesson 6: The Difference Between the New Testament and the Old Testament, the Apocrypha, the False Revelations, and the Translations

Lesson Focus

The Bible is the most precious gift of God for man and we should treasure that we have a translated Bible, and in particular the Recovery Version translation, to help us accurately enter into the revelation in the Word of God. We should develop a habit and practice of reading the Bible, preferably in physical form, to allow the Lord to lead us on a journey of discovering the truth and light in the Word.

Key Verses

Heb. 8:8 ...Behold the days are coming, says the Lord, and I will consummate a new covenant upon the house of Israel and upon the house of Judah.

Lesson 7: Our Attitude Toward the Bible

Lesson Focus

Although we may read the Bible, we may not fully understand it, think what we read is impossible, not fully agree with it, or not even like what we read. However, we can accept, agree with, and believe in God's word. This very much depends on our knowing the truth in the Bible. The truth we know in the Bible will be the truth we can apply. All of this can greatly uplift our attitude toward the Bible.

Key Verses

Num. 23:19 God is not a man, that He should lie, / Nor a son of man, that He should repent. / Has He said, and will He not do it? / Or has He spoken, and will He not establish it?

Psa. 119:66 Teach me proper discernment and knowledge, / For I believe in Your commandments.

2 Cor. 4:13 And having the same spirit of faith according to that which is written "I believed, therefore I spoke," we also believe, therefore we also speak.

Outline

- I. We can accept, agree with, and believe in the Bible, the word of God; if we lack understanding, we can pray and fellowship until we are clear.
- II. In order to have the opportunity to accept, agree with, and believe in God's word, we need to know the truth in the Bible; key verses can serve as an entrance into the Bible (e.g Rom. 10:9, 13; John 10:28-29; 1 John 1:7, 9; Lam. 3:56; 1 Pet. 5:7; Heb. 4:15)
- III. By knowing the truth, we can then apply the truth in our daily Christian life and in the church life.

Lesson 8: The Burden of Reconstitution

Lesson Focus

We need to love God and His word. God's word conveys God Himself to us. By our coming to the word we contact God and can receive God in order to be reconstituted with God for His eternal dwelling place. This is God's purpose.

Key Verses

Psa. 119:9 With what should a young man keep his way pure? / By guarding *it* according to Your word.

John 17:17 Sanctify then in the truth; Your word is truth.

- When we come to chapter sixteen, we see the importance of being reconstituted.
- Although the children of Israel had been redeemed and delivered, they were still Egyptian in their constitution.
- God's desire is to use His people as the material for the building of His habitation on earth.
- We need to see the significance of God's sending the quails and the manna.
- Eating quails makes people wild and unrestricted, but eating manna regulates them and causes them to be according to God.
- We have spoken many times of the Egyptian diet.

- 1. Recite and memorize Psalm 119:9 and John 17:17 and speak it to one another.
- 2. Pick one of those versus (Psalm 119:9 or John 17:17) and pray together with it.
- 3. What is the Egyptian diet and what of the Egyptian diet do you personally eat?
- 4. What is the heavenly diet and what is the purpose of the heavenly diet?
- 5. How can we be constituted with the truth?

Lesson 9: The Way to Enjoy the Bible—By Letting the Word of Christ Dwell in Us Richly

Lesson Focus

Letting the word of Christ dwell in us richly is one of the greatest blessings in our Christian life. When the Word of Christ begins to inhabit us in this way the word has an opportunity to speak to us and reveal Himself to us. The result of this really should be joy in our hearts. The kind of Word that indwells and moves and operates in us is different or opposed to the Word that we may just read or study in an external or objective way that never really enters us. We might know about it but there is no living component of it really at work in our being correcting, adjust and living in harmony with the Christ who is living within.

Key Verses

Col. 3:16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another with psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to God.

John 6:63 It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing; the words which I have spoken to you are spirit and are life.

Eph. 6:17b-18a Receive...the sword of the Spirit, which Spirit is the Word of God, by means of all prayer and petition, praying at every time in spirit...

Psa. 119:130 The opening of Your words gives light, Imparting understanding to the simple.

Our studying is not only for ourselves but for preaching the gospel to produce members for the Body of Christ and to build up the church.

Key Verses

1 Cor. 14:1, 3-4

1 Pursue love, and desire earnestly spiritual gifts, but especially that you may prophesy. 3 But he who prophesies speaks building up and encouragement and consolation to men. 4 He who speaks in a tongue builds up himself, but he who prophesies builds up the church.
