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Lesson 1: The Vision of the Church

Lesson Focus

We are not only individual Christians, we are also a corporate entity—the church. God's full salvation is to redeem, regenerate, and transform His chosen people for the church.

Key Verses

Eph. 3:9-11

9 And to enlighten all that they may see what the economy of the mystery is, which throughout the ages has been hidden in God, who created all things **10** In order that now to the rulers and the authorities in the heavenlies the multifarious wisdom of God might be made known through the church, **11** According to the eternal purpose which He made in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Lesson 2: God's Purpose for the Church

Lesson Focus

In God's dispensation, in God's administration, in God's arrangement, in God's governmental stewardship, He has eternally planned the church. The church is the central matter in God's economy. Putting it into human terms, the church is God's business.

Key Verses

Eph. 1:5 Predestinating us unto sonship through Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will.

Eph. 3:10 In order that now to the rulers and the authorities in the heavenlies the multifarious wisdom of God might be made known through the church.

Eph. 1:10 Unto the economy of the fullness of the times, to head up all things in Christ, the things in the heavens and the things on the earth, in Him.

Lesson Focus

The two crucial aspects of the church—the universal and local aspects. The truths in the Bible always have two sides. Brother Govett called it "the twofoldness of the truth." A sheet of paper has two sides as it cannot exist with one side only; likewise, the church has two aspects.

Key Verses

Matt. 16:18 And I also say to you that you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build My church, and the gates of Hades shall not prevail against it.

Rev. 1:11 Saying, What you see write in a scroll and send it to the seven churches: to Ephesus and to Smyrna and to Pergamos and to Thyatira and to Sardis and to Philadelphia and to Laodicea.

Lesson 4: The Seven Churches in Revelation Signifying the Seven Stages of the Church

Lesson Focus

Revelation is a book of prophecy (Rev. 1:3; 22:7). The seven epistles to the seven churches in chapters two and three, in the sense of signs, are prophecies regarding the church on earth until the Lord's coming back.

Key Verse

Rev. 1:20 The mystery of the seven stars which you saw upon My right hand and the seven golden lampstands: The seven stars are the messengers of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches.

Outline

- I. The church in Ephesus depicts the end of the stage of the initial church during the last part of the first century.
- II. The church in Smyrna prefigures the suffering church under the persecution of the Roman Empire from the last part of the first century to the early part of the fourth century.
- III. The church in Pergamos pre-symbolizes the worldly church, the church married to the world.
- IV. The church in Thyatira pre-symbolizes the apostate church from the ordination of the papal system in the latter part of the sixth century to the end of the church age.
- V. The church in Sardis prefigures the protestant church, from the reformation in the early part of the sixteenth century to Christ's coming back.
- VI. The church in Philadelphia prefigures the church of brotherly love, the recovery of the proper church life, from the early part of the nineteenth century to the second appearing of the Lord.
- VII. The church in Laodicea foreshadows the degraded church life of the brothers from the latter part of the nineteenth century to the Lord's return.

Lesson 5: The Status of the Church (1) The Assembly, the House of God, and the Kingdom of God

Lesson Focus

The church as an assembly is separated from the world; the church as the house of God is composed of those who have been born of God; and the church as the kingdom of God, is the reality and living of the church today. We all need to grow in the divine life in the church life so that in the coming age we may have a rich entrance into the kingdom of God.

Key Verses

1 Cor. 1:2 To the church of God which is in Corinth, to those who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, the called saints, with all those who call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ in every place, [who is] theirs and ours.

1 Tim. 3:15 But if I delay, [I write] that you may know how one ought to conduct himself in the house of God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and base of the truth.

Rom. 14:17 For the kingdom of God is not eating and drinking, but righteousness and peace and joy in the Holy Spirit.

Lesson Focus

The very abstract and mysterious God has an organism. God is invisible, yet He has a visible organism, the Body of Christ. The church as the Body of Christ is for His fullness, His expression.

Key Verses

Eph. 1:22-23

22 And He subjected all things under His feet and gave Him [to be] Head over all things to the church, **23** Which is His Body, the fullness of the One who fills all in all.

Lesson 7: The Status of the Church (3) God's Masterpiece, the New Man, and the Counterpart of Christ

Lesson Focus

God has made many things, but none of them is as dear, precious, valuable, and desirable as the church. The church is God's masterpiece. As God's masterpiece, the church is the Body of Christ, the fullness of the One who fills all in all. Furthermore, the church as God's masterpiece is the corporate and universal new man.

Key Verses

Eph. 2:10 For we are His masterpiece, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand in order that we would walk in them.

Eph. 2:15 Abolishing in His flesh the law of the commandments in ordinances, that He might create the two in Himself into one new man, [so] making peace.

Rev. 19:7 Let us rejoice and exult, and let us give the glory to Him, for the marriage of the Lamb has come, and His wife has made herself ready.

Lesson 8: The Status of the Church (4) The Golden Lampstands

Lesson Focus

The golden lampstands are the final aspect of the status of the church. This aspect is very exciting because the same symbol was used for the Triune God, the children of Israel, and the church. We will be mingled with Him to such an extent that we will express Him in full.

Key Verses

Rev. 1:12 And I turned to see the voice that spoke with me; and when I turned, I saw seven golden lampstands.

Rev. 1:20 The mystery of the seven stars which you saw upon My right hand and the seven golden lampstands: The seven stars are the messengers of the seven churches, and the seven lampstands are the seven churches.

- I. The golden lampstands typifying Christ as the embodiment of the Triune God
 - A. Gold signifying the Father's divine nature, the divine substance, essence
 - B. The form signifying the Son as the embodiment of the Godhead in His humanity
 - C. The seven lamps signifying the Spirit as the expression
- II. The golden lampstands signifying Israel as God's testimony in the Old Testament and in the millennium
- III. The golden lampstands signifying the seven local churches as God's testimony in the New Testament

Lesson 9: The Direct Building Up of the Body of Christ by the Perfected Saints

Lesson Focus

In this lesson we will see that God's intention is to give the gifted persons—the apostles, prophets, evangelists, shepherds and teachers—to perfect the saints that all the saints may participate in the work of the building up of the Body of Christ. These gifted persons perfect the saints to be what they are.

Key Verses

Eph. 4:12-13

12 For the perfecting of the saints unto the work of the ministry, unto the building up of the Body of Christ, **13** Until we all arrive at the oneness of the faith and of the full knowledge of the Son of God, at a full-grown man, at the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ.

2 Cor. 4:1 Therefore having this ministry as we have been shown mercy, we do not lose heart.

Dan. 1:8 But Daniel set his heart not to defile himself with the king's choice provision and with the wine that the king drank, so he requested of the leader of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself.
